


Lincolnshire

Lincoln Castle

(1 hour approx.) Discover a world of rich history at Lincoln Castle, dating back to 1068 and home to one of only four surviving copies of 1215 Magna Carta.

Built by William the Conqueror in 1068 on a site occupied since Roman times, Lincoln Castle has dominated the Lincoln skyline for almost one thousand years. Inside the Castle walls is also a Victorian prison giving an insight into crime and punishment in the Lincoln of the past.



Doddington Hall and Gardens

(1 hour approx.) Doddington Hall is a privately owned fine late Elizabethan Mansion with stunning gardens, located just outside Lincoln.

Begun in 1595 by Robert Smythson, one of England's foremost Elizabethan Architects, Doddington Hall was completed in 1600 and has never been sold or cleared out since.

Flight (1 hour approx.)

Experience Lincolnshire's aviation heritage at close quarters with a guided tour of the RAF's heritage aircraft hangar.

Lincoln Cathedral

(1 hour approx.)

One of Europe's finest Gothic buildings, once the tallest in the world, with stunning views from the roof and tower and intricate design inside. Once described by Victorian writer John Ruskin as "out and out the most precious piece of architecture in the British Isles and roughly speaking worth any two other cathedral we have", Lincoln Cathedral is not to be missed.



Sherwood Forest

(2-3 hour approx.)

Once part of a royal hunting forest, Sherwood Forest National Nature Reserve covers 450 acres and incorporates some truly ancient areas of native woodland where slender birch trees grow alongside more than one thousand veteran oaks, most of which are over 500 years old.

The largest and most famous of these is the Major Oak - linked throughout the world to Sherwoods legendary hero Robin Hood.



Nottingham Castle Cave Tour

(2-3 hours approx.)

The complex network of caves hidden beneath Nottingham's streets have had a firm influence on the fabric of the city's history. Naturally, some of the most dramatic and well preserved tales were based around the castle quarter, and this fascinating tour lets you in on all the secrets whilst exploring behind the scenes areas of Nottingham Castle. Take a tour to experience the caves for yourself, learning on the way the gruesome tales of Roger Mortimer, King David II of Scotland or you may be able to take a tour with Robin Hood himself...



Clumber Park

(2 hours approx.)

This wide expanse of parkland, farmland and woods covers over 3800-acres (1500 hectares) and was once the seat of the Dukes of Newcastle.

There are over 120 different types of tree at this wonderful National Trust property, offering year-round colour and including the memorable avenue of limes, 2 miles (3km) long, which forms the main approach.

Although the mansion was demolished in 1938, many original Clumber Park estate features survive, including the Victorian chapel, a Gothic Revival 'mini-cathedral', stable yard and garages and ornate entrance lodges. Particularly fascinating are the superb 19th-century glasshouses, which incorporate a palm house, vineries and working apiary, and overlook the walled kitchen garden. An avenue of cedars leads to the pleasure grounds.
